Intrahepatic cholestasis of pregnancy (ICP) is a liver disorder that occurs during the third trimester of pregnancy, and affects the flow of bile from the liver. It is caused by hormonal, environmental, and genetic factors. Some effects of ICP are liver dysfunction, jaundice (yellowing of eyes and skin), preterm labor, respiratory issues, and meconium staining.

Although serious, the main effects on the mother are intense itching in the hands and feet which worsens at night, and stillbirth.



ICP is diagnosed through blood work or, sometimes, a liver ultrasound. The main tests include enzyme tests, which measure enzyme activity in blood, urine, or tissue samples.



Policies Impacting ICP

Momnibus Act

The Momnibus Act is designed to improve maternal health, especially for Black, Indigenous, and other women of color. It was introduced by the Black Maternal Health Caucus to address health disparities. The goal is to reduce maternal mortality and morbidity, particularly in communities disproportionately affected by these issues.

Extended Medicaid Coverage

This bill allows new mothers to stay covered by Medicaid for up to 12 months after giving birth, instead of the usual 60 days. This helps to ensure they get the necessary medical care, including mental health issues, reducing risks of complications after childbirth. The goal is to improve maternal health outcomes, especially for those at higher risks of postpartum health problems.
